Picture Butte High School: School Profile

PBHS is situated within a diverse community of roughly 3000 inhabitants serving the communities of Picture Butte, Shaugnessy and Iron Springs. Students in our catchment area have over eight educational options on where their students go to school which has created strong competition in attracting students to PBHS. The School houses grades 7 to 12 in Junior and Senior High levels, and offers a broad academic program complemented by a trades and career focused set of elective courses. Many students and teachers are also involved in the various extracurricular programs offered through the School. They include sports programs, social functions, and courses in the arts.

Evaluation

- The data is not complete as only seven parents and three teachers submitted responses. Anecdotal evidence would suggest a higher satisfaction rate.
- When comparing the available data to the Provincial responses, PBHS enjoys a favorable comparison.
- o Parent participation is up for Parent council meetings.

- o PBHS is continuing to prioritize student engagement and citizenry through fostering simple values of respect and kindness.
- o All student and community viewpoints are considered prior to each activity or initiative with the well being of all community members being front of mind.
- o The recent focus of promoting hands-on, problem solving learning through our programs (like Farm Ed) has been very successful in increasing student participation and engagement in school activities. Parents have been equally happy to see their children exposed to more practical life learning skills.
- o Based on a projected increase in students with Spanish speaking backgrounds, PBHS is hiring staff that reflect and can help serve this demographic.
- o Based on community context, junior and senior high option programming is specifically designed to appeal to and enrich students of this school.

 - o parental perception has improved drastically over the last three years.
- Strategies
 - There is a primary focus of respect and kindness in all interactions at our school
 - A primary goal of the school is that every person in the building is linked to at least one other caring person or adult.
 - Diversity is celebrated in our school.
 - Programming for special needs students has moved away from a deficit model and reflects student's strengths.
 - Based on community context, junior and senior high option programming is specifically designed to appeal to and enrich students of this school.
 - PBHS offers a breakfast and lunch program to those students in need. In addition, PBHS offers an entire school breakfast program for the stressful exam months of January and June. This has been very well received.
 - Student leaders are engaged in, and delivering on, the principles and practices of HeadStrong, an initiative to promote student leadership and citizenship.
 - PBHS has instituted a 'new student' plan to help welcome new students into the building.

Highlights

- While PBHS was successful at meeting the mental health needs of students and staff, we were not successful in maintaining the academic rigor and capacity of both our students and staff. Results have improved since the Covid year of 2019/2020, but more work is yet to be done to improve the academic rigor within PBHS.
- PBHS has recognized the desire of community and students to offer a greater breadth of programming that focuses more on college programming as compared to university options. This has resulted in a substantial change in the focus of core courses and the types of CTS options that are now being offered.
- Parents and students are happy with the culture and direction of the school but academic results are not on par with this satisfaction. More emphasis is required on improving the academic achievements of our students.

Challenges

- return to full academic rigor in classrooms is still a challenge. Many of our students are still not ready to meet the demands of what is required to meet high academic standards.
- Staff need to revisit assessment practices and teaching strategies to maximize academic

success.

- High rates of truancy are still being felt at PBHS.
- High rates of students with mental health challenges exist within the school community.
- In the past year and a half, PBHS has experienced a 500% increase in our EAL population adding another layer of complexity to our academic environment. This new population is changing the nature and needs within the academic classrooms and is a factor that requires more attention.

Picture Butte High School: Final Notes and Reflection

Our school has been in enrolment decline but we are now stabilizing. PBHS competes against eight other schools for attendance. Three schools are within division and the remainder are from outside of Palliser. Each school offers a unique set of opportunities and challenges. The sheer number of different options has presented both challenges and opportunities to PBHS. We now offer programming that is distinctly unique to other schools vying for students in our own catchment area. In 2022, we launched our FarmEd program which is a distinctly hands-on, problem solving, agriculturally focused course. After seeing the success of this program, we are now expanding our programming into other related trades areas which are being highly embraced by our school community.

Similar to other schools in the south, we are continuing to see an increase in students with mental health issues and socio-economic issues. With continued increasing budgetary constrictions, the challenge of meeting unique learning needs of each student is becoming increasingly more difficult. The learning support system of PBHS is facing increasing demands and needs with decreasing supports and services. This challenge is likely going to be one of our most difficult areas to find effective solutions in meeting the needs and demands of every student and family.

As a small school, we are making every effort to provide the best experience possible for every student that attends. Despite all of our challenges, we feel we are improving the opportunities, experiences and culture at PBHS.
